# **THOUGHTS OF THE PASTOR**

#### Aldersgate Day – May 24th

On May 24 1738, 280 years ago, John Wesley was at the Moravian meeting house on Aldersgate Street in London. The preface to Luther's commentary on the book of Romans was being read. At that meeting John Wesley's life was changed. He later wrote in his journal that at about 8:45 p.m. "while he was describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone for salvation; and an assurance was given me that He had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death."

Some people point to this as John Wesley's conversion experience. He had certainly believed before this event that Jesus was the Son of God who died for the sins of the world. He was, on a theological level, a Christian. His basic understanding of doctrine and theology did not change. As a Fellow of Oxford he certainly had read Luther's commentary on Romans and had studied Romans and the entire Bible. He had also already developed a methodical practice of devotion and service to God. His behavior of prayer and study and service and his belief in God and Jesus did not change. What changed at Aldersgate was his heart. Charles Wesley had



a similar experience just a few days earlier. Some think of this as the Wesley brothers' hearts catching up to their heads and hands. They had already changed their thinking and their actions, but this was their hearts changing! They had been trusting in Christ in their heads and in their action but now they trusted in their hearts and had an assurance in their hearts that God loved them and had forgiven them.

This change of heart is an important part of what it means to be a Methodist. As "Aldersgate" United Methodist Church we bear the name of that heartwarming experience. Each Sunday we say that at Aldersgate we are "Hearts on Fire ... Seeking, Sharing, Serving ... For God!" That "hearts on fire" is not just an allusion to the fire that burned the sanctuary back in the '90s. It is a reference to that change of heart experienced by the Wesley brothers and that we experience today.

As we recall the Wesley's Aldersgate experience this May 24, may we experience the warming of our hearts and seek to bring that same love and warmth to others.


