

THOUGHTS OF THE PASTOR

HEARTS ON FIRE...Seeking, sharing, serving, For God.

As I was going through the stuff in my office to pack it up, I came across a copy of the vision plan that Aldersgate put together before I arrived. I remember being handed a 15-page statement of the vision and goals for the church, and thinking “this church has a vision!” As I look back over the last 4 years, I can see all that we have accomplished in this time!

Among the accomplishments called for in this vision statement is the establishment of a culture of hospitality. I believe, from the comments of visitors and prospective members, that Aldersgate is a friendlier church and that this hospitality goes beyond what is customary. We are generously hospitable! We have also expanded the roles of A.C.T. (Aldersgate Caring Team) and Stephen Ministries. As a pastor it is hard to care pastorally for over a thousand members, but these groups are an invaluable help in caring for such a vast congregation.

In worship we have made monthly communion a standard and have made the music more diverse. Our music staff has grown in size and in quality over the last four years. Personally, as a member of the choir I have seen the quality of that group grow. And the same can be said for the Praise Band, the Handbell Choir and the Children’s and Cherub Choirs. Recently, we have added the Instrumental Ensemble to the mix. And now, after years of planning, we have incorporated visual media into the service in a seamless manner, so that it enhances the service and makes worship more accessible to newcomers.

Missions has always been a strength at Aldersgate. One missions goal was to implement church wide missions events. We did this with 2 Great Days of Service and also the “Love Starts Here” emphasis with its “1,000 Act of Love” last year during lent. These have opened up new ministries including the Refuge Sports ESL (English as a Second Language) and after school program for former refugees, as well as the Mosaic after school ESL program.

Other areas of goals that we have made progress on are to use diverse forms of print and electronic communications. We have also offered a wide variety of studies and disciple making opportunities including Companion groups! Messy Church has been developed and become a wonderful outreach and disciple making tool.

There are a few unrealized goals. One of the things mentioned in the Vision Plan that have not been realized is a Welcome Center, but plans are in the works to construct one! Another is worship attendance growth. It is growing, but slowly. Also exploring the possibility of an outdoor electronic sign.

I have only scratched the surface in these paragraphs. This progress began before I arrived here, and I expect that it will continue after I have left. As long as Aldersgate stays true to its vision of being “Hearts on fire ... Seeking, Sharing, Serving ... for God” I believe this growth will continue! You will continue to “make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world” both here in Greenville and around the world. I look forward to hearing great things from Aldersgate. I will pray for you and please pray for me, and we will see the glory of God revealed in Aldersgate’s ministry in the years to come!



PENTECOST—THE CHURCH’S BIRTHDAY!

Pentecost is the 50th day after the resurrection. Jesus appeared to his disciples for 40 days and then ascended into heaven then ten days later was the Jewish festival of the first fruits also called Pentecost. While believers in God from every nation of the known world were coming to Jerusalem, God poured out the Holy Spirit on the disciples and they proclaimed the Good News in all the languages of the people present. Some say this was the birth of the church because this is the first time that the disciples began carrying out Jesus’ commission to make disciples of all nations.

It was the Holy Spirit, God with us, that God sent to strengthen, guide, empower and comfort the church, which made their bold proclamation possible. That same Holy Spirit is still with us empowering believers to live and proclaim the Gospel. The color red is used in worship to represent the fire of the Holy Spirit, which came upon the church at Pentecost. Pentecost falls on June 9th this year. Come to church and celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit!


PEACE WITH JUSTICE SUNDAY



Sunday, June 16 is **Peace with Justice Sunday at Aldersgate!** On this Sunday United Methodist Churches worldwide receive a special offering which supports peace and justice ministries locally and around the world. The first 50% of the offering received is earmarked for peace and justice ministries here in SC and the other 50% to ministries worldwide. Last year peace with justice grants have empowered Methodists to spearhead a peace ministry uniting Arizona communities. They have helped United Methodists in Liberia implement the denominations social principles to address social-justice issues. They have equipped Pennsylvania students to educate their community about sex trafficking. And many other things! Please prayerfully consider giving a little extra to this offering. HOLY TRINITY

The doctrine of the Trinity is one of the most unique and characteristic doctrines of the Christian faith. It simply states that there is one God revealed in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We have many different symbols for the trinity including the triangle which is one shape with three sides. On the first Sunday after Pentecost, June 16 this year, we will celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in our worship. Come join us for God is truly Great!



BEREAVEMENT COMMITTEE

The Bereavement Committee is a ministry of Aldersgate UMC that assists the family of all church members who pass away. The leader is Daylene Altman, assisted by Cookie Dobbs and Jane Williamson. When they are notified of the death of a member, they immediately contact a family member to find out the needs of the family and let them know what our church provides to help them. One of these members walks with the family from the time they are notified of the death until after the service.

A quick response team, which is a group of our church members, immediately visits the family and provides them with items such as tea, coffee, breakfast items, luncheon provisions and paper goods.

The quick response team is also responsible for planning a meal if the family would like to have one. This is usually done in Parker Hall and is provided by our church members.




UMW CRAFT DAY



Of most need currently are volunteers for the classrooms, but we will need plenty of people to help with decorating, pre-crafting work and miscellaneous projects.

- our theme this year is *OUTER SPACE*, so if you have any thoughts on decorating or have things we could use to decorate with – start putting them aside. If you need some inspiration, go to pinter-est.com and type in “space decorations”. There are some great ones out there. If you would be willing to help us construct items, we could use your help.
- If you don’t think you can help physically, we are always grateful for financial support. We are one of the few churches left that do not charge for VBS!
- Here is the “*Wish List*” that we will put out, for items you probably already have. Here are a lot already:
 - * ½ gal paper milk containers – washed and dried. We could also use a smaller sizes- like half and half con-tainers.
 - * Blue light or colored light fixtures to make our stage “look spacey”.

 - * Large 3M removeable hooks
 - * Cotton rope (no poly or nylon)
 - * Playing dice from Dollar Tree
 - * Hefty & regular rubber bands
 - * Jumbo Large popsicle sticks (8”)
 - * Granola bar wrappers
 - * Small metal eye screws
 - * 1” metal washers
 - * Scrapbooking sheets (space/neon/glitter colors)
 - * Colorful electric and duck tape
 - * New toothbrushes & toothpaste
