THOUGHTS OF THE PASTOR

The Place of Aldersgate in Methodism

In early 1738, John Wesley was at a low point in his life. He had just returned from a frustrating failure in ministry in Savannah, Georgia. But he reluctantly accepted an invitation to attend a group meeting located in an upper room somewhere on Aldersgate Street in London. It was May 24, 1738.

At the meeting, there was a reading from the introduction to Martin Luther's commentary on Romans. Wesley describes what happened: "While he [Luther] was describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone for salvation; and an assurance was given me that he had taken away *my* sins even *mine*, and saved *me* from the law of sin and death." Wesley understood this to be a work of the Holy Spirit that assured him of God's love—that his salvation was a gift by grace through faith alone. This realization led to the fire of the Methodist Movement sweeping across England and the United States. So Aldersgate Church was named for a very special place in the life of John Wesley and Methodism, and the beginning of our vision, "Hearts on Fire," is an echo of Wesley's statement that his heart was "strangely warmed."

On Sunday June 14, I gave an altar call that was an invitation to "live LIFE to the fullest." This is an invitation to live out God's call here at Aldersgate to be the kind of church where people receive an assurance that God loves them, even them.

God wants to do this work through, of all people, us. So I invite you again. Let's live LIFE to the fullest. Let's work hard to make Aldersgate the kind of place God wants it to be. And let's invite people to come here and find what we have found: a welcome worth receiving and a heritage worth having. I'll see you on Sunday.

HOME GATHERINGS

HOME GATHERINGS ARE COMING: In the next week or so, you may receive an invitation to attend a "Home Gathering." These are small groups *(15 or less)* of persons who will meet in members' homes with Pastor Michael beginning on July 31. This is an informal setting for him to meet and get to know the people of Aldersgate. We hope that you will take advantage of this opportunity. Each of us will only need to attend a single Home Gathering, and there will be multiple opportunities to attend in case you cannot make it to a particular one. **CONFIRMATION**—The Confirmation journey at Aldersgate will begin in late August/early September. As we prepare for this upcoming class, please let Johannah know if you have a youth who will be participating in the Confirmation class during the 2019-2020 school year. The class is open to students 6th grade and older.

COMPANION GROUPS AT ALDERSGATE are forming in August 2019 for the 2019-2020 school year! Companion Groups are small, house groups that meet monthly for a meal and Bible study together. The word "companion" has roots in "co" and "pan" or "together with bread." When we gather around a meal, relationships deepen and we find COMPANIONS for our journey with God.

What makes Companion groups different from other small groups is that they are intentionally inter-generational. Discipleship works best when we apprentice faith alongside people who are learning to practice their faith, too. That means we need people from all generations working together.

Companion groups are open to families of all shapes and sizes, from singles to grandparents and everyone in between. If you'd like more information, please contact Johannah (jmyers@aumcsc.org). We are also looking for a lot of help for this sale. We need more than the usual number of people to help out as this will almost be


